COVID-19 RESPONSE

As with any organization involved in seniors care and housing, the COVID-19 pandemic has been a challenging time. Our organization responded immediately with the formation of a COVID-19 response team responsible for providing direction and support on COVID-19 protocols and health authority requirements.

Relative to other situations in Canada, Baptist Housing's confirmed cases of COVID-19 remained fairly small, with only one sustained outbreak. The impact on our residents and loved ones was still felt deeply.

We have seen a significant decline in COVID-19 cases since vaccinations began. On-site clinics proved to be a very efficient way for residents and teams to receive their vaccines and in many cases we were able to have essential visitors or other regular service providers vaccinated at the same time.

In this next phase of the pandemic, there remains a strong focus on immunization and infection control so that we may protect all those who live and work in a Baptist Housing community.













HOSPITALITY

This past year our team was very creative in the delivery of our hospitality services. Due to the pandemic, meal service and housekeeping changed significantly. In April our dining rooms closed and meals were delivered in suite. A few months later dining rooms were reopened with fewer tables and residents spaced apart. A full year later we are thankful to welcome residents back to the dining room in a way that provides a more normal dining experience. This process took a lot of planning, collaboration and adaptability from all of our team members and residents.

Despite all of these challenges, we served approximately 1.9 million meals across Baptist Housing. On top of this we served almost 8,000 meals to the community of White Rock / South Surrey through our Meals on Wheels program that is operated out of Evergreen.

TEAM GROWTH

Baptist Housing has applied for, and been awarded, 80 positions through the Health Career Access program (HCAP), making us a leader among affiliates. HCAP is a new government funded, paid work and training initiative for individuals seeking an entry point to employment in health care. Participants commence the program as Health Care Support Workers. Upon completion of the work and training program, they graduate as Health Care Aides. We believe HCAP presents a tremendous opportunity for us and the individual participants. It allows Baptist Housing to fill a need for non-direct care assistance. At the same time, HCAP allows individual participants to pursue a career in health care which was previously out of reach.













SPIRITUAL CARE

"Our ministry produced by faith, prompted by love, and inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." –1 THESSALONIANS 1:3

Baptist Housing has an amazing and diverse team of spiritual care providers with incredible hearts for others. Since Chaplains have been considered essential workers, they have all stayed engaged personally with residents during this past year.

The following story incapsulates the impact that our spiritual care team can make as they live out our values in everything they do. It's from Jeannette Guerrero, our chaplain at Grandview Towers and a resident who will be referred to as "J." A resident shared the tragic loss of a close of a close friend. Our chaplain listened to "J" as she shared her story and comforted her, encouraging her not to feel responsible for the accident. They prayed together. As she was leaving the chaplain's office, through tears she said. "In this place, I have found peace—peace that I have not felt in a long time. In this place I was able to find myself again. Do you know what it's like to lose yourself for a long time? To not know who you are and just rely on people's perception of you? It is a scary feeling. But, there is something about this place and the people who work here that makes me feel safe. I don't know what it is, and I don't know how to describe it. But it's moments like these that I know I can be vulnerable and I can shout and be angry, and still know I will not feel guilt or be condemned for my actions. I can just be me."

Our spiritual care ministry, supported by our chaplains and spiritual care volunteers, aims to build trusting relationships to support our residents to live life to the fullest.



VOLUNTEERS

This past year has been like no other, yet our volunteers continue to bless us with their many kindnesses. They have found creative ways to stay engaged, even from a distance. Our volunteers have made masks, special headbands, ear guards, blankets, pocket aprons and wheelchair & walker bags by the thousands. Others have done virtual visits & Bible studies, performed concerts (both virtual & outdoor), sent cards & letters, put together gift boxes, provided groceries and assisted with data entry and special craft projects. Many of our resident volunteers continued to serve in their community with program setup, gardening and the general store. Community support came from Telus Ambassadors, UBC Nursing students, Society Pursuits Project Canada, Canadian Blood Services Plasma Centre, various churches, Elementary & Secondary Schools and Ladies Auxiliaries. We are so grateful to each one!

In reading the quote, "The heart of a volunteer is not measured in size, but by the depth of the commitment to make a difference in the lives of others," a Kelowna volunteer came to mind. Kevin assists with the Music and Memory Program and has been volunteering virtually this past year, using a laptop and iPods to download music for our residents. In October 2020, Kevin and his wife were out walking when he received a phone call from his son, informing them that their home was on fire. They quickly went back to find the fire department fighting the blaze. Kevin mentioned to one of the firefighters that he needed to get into the house to get something that was valuable and couldn't be replaced. The firefighter escorted Kevin in and he was able to save the laptop along with the iPods for the Music and Memory program. Upon questioning Kevin why he felt he needed to go back, his response was, "I value my volunteering and I know that iPods are no longer available to buy." So heartwarming to think that this was the first thing that came to his mind! Kevin and his family are now in a furnished home for one year until their home is rebuilt and he continues to volunteer, enhancing the lives of our residents through music therapy. This is just one of the many stories of how dedicated and selfless our volunteers are!

MAJOR PROJECTS

INGLEWOOD CARE CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

In partnership with BC Housing and the Ministry of Health, Baptist Housing proposes to replace the existing Inglewood Care Centre with an inclusive, next generation, Continuum of Care.

The master plan proposes a synergistic combination of quality Long Term Care, Assisted Living, Independent Living, Affordable Housing for Seniors and for team members.

The design and redevelopment of Ingelwood Care Centre will require a phased approach. After many iterations and numerous meetings and consultation with teams and the public, our application has been submitted to West Vancouver Council for their approval to rezone the site and acquire a Comprehensive Development Permit. Currently the Inglewood site consists of Inglewood Care Centre, with 230 funded long term care beds and 4 adjacent single family properties.

Our proposal, if approved, will include the replacement of the 230 funded beds with an additional 10 private pay beds. This should be completed in 2025. Once built, residents living in the current building will be able to move into the new care residence. Building will then commence on phases 2 and 3. These phases consist of a private pay Assisted Living and Long Term Care residence for 108 residents, an Affordable Housing residence with 107 suites for team members and 48 suites for seniors. We are also building a rental residence for independent seniors that will offer 124 Life Lease suites and 76 Independent Living suites. We hope to have the entire project completed in 2029.

MAJOR PROJECTS

REVITALIZATION OF LINWOOD

Baptist Housing will revitalize 3200 Linwood Avenue in Saanich with a new affordable seniors housing community, offering 97 one bedroom suites with amenity spaces, outdoor gardens and underground parking.

We have been working on the redevelopment of Linwood Court since 2016. Despite the delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, we have received Saanich Council's development permit and rezoning approval. We have partnered with Knappett Projects to construct the building and anticipate it will be complete in 2022.
