

WELCOME TO THE TEAM

Amid COVID-19 the government recognized the critical need to increase the number of Care Aides in British Columbia and so implemented the Health Career Access Program (HCAP).

HCAP is a paid work and training initiative for individuals seeking an entry point to employment in health. New hires start as a Health Care Support Worker providing non-direct care at a long-term care or assisted living residence and receive paid training to become a Health Care Assistant upon successful completion of the program.

Baptist Housing embraced the program and was one of the largest adopters with over 60 candidates. Many of these new team members had never had an opportunity to go to school and their journey through the HCAP program is inspiring.

This Spring we celebrated the first round of graduates, many of whom have accepted permanent positions or joined our casual relief team. We are now into our second time participating in the program with another keen and dedicated group of HCAP participants joining Baptist Housing.

SPIRITUAL CARE

DIVERSITY AND MEANINGFUL CONNECTIONS

Baptist Housing's spiritual care team now consists of 18 chaplains who come from six different countries who have served as missionaries, pastors, and even seminary presidents. Collectively our team can communicate in 12 languages. God is using our chaplain's experiences to help us minister to an ethnically diverse community of residents and team members.

We recently took some time to consider how to show God is using our efforts to impact others. After considering a variety of options we decided to focus on the "meaningful connections" God gives us with others. We define these connections as more than just casual conversations about the weather or the latest news, but times with others when they willingly talk about deeper issues or engage in exploring issues of a spiritual nature. We have been pleasantly surprised at how God has been answering our requests to have these special visits and by how our diversity has opened doors for us to engage with others.











VOLUNTEERS

National Volunteer Week 2022 theme was "Volunteering is empathy in action". This certainly describes our Baptist Housing volunteers, who put empathy into action day after day. Much of their work is performed quietly behind the scenes and done without expectation of recognition or reward. However, their selfless acts of kindness do not go unnoticed. We often hear from team members and families how volunteers are making a difference in the lives of our residents. Laura is one such volunteer, and has been serving at Inglewood since 2014, when she was in Grade 5! Maybe one recalls the bracelet looming craze? She had her entire class looming bracelets at recess and at lunch for a couple of weeks, then delivered them to Inglewood on Valentine's Day along with carefully crafted Valentine's cards. After that visit, Laura was hooked on volunteering. That same year, her mom helped her make her first gingerbread house and it's been an annual tradition ever since, bringing joy into the lives of Inglewood residents. Throughout the years, Laura has made crafts,

brought candy jars and flower posies, cultivated and donated plants, played piano, taken Instax photos, created short memoirs to leave residents and has written over 1,000 cards and letters. Often, she will just sit and listen to the wonderful stories of lives well-lived. Laura recently commented in her email, "I like the theme of 'Volunteering is Empathy in Action' because that's exactly how I feel about my volunteer role. Supporting all the vulnerable in our local and global society is a role we should all feel drawn to. I certainly do feel blessed.' We are so grateful for such a servant-heart for Inglewood!

Hearing from our volunteers, heartwarming stories of meaningful connections, and how blessed they feel to have the opportunity to volunteer with Baptist Housing, reminds us of the quote, "Love and kindness are never wasted. They always make a difference. They bless the one who receives, and they bless the giver."



INSPIRATION FROM OUR VOLUNTEERS

"The residents all just appreciate someone taking the time to talk to them and care about their well-being. All of us need to be loved and listened to. I love to hear their stories about life. They teach me about life, wisdom, and truth. Many share the difficulties they face in life, and sometimes their regrets. I volunteer so that I can walk alongside residents, to show Christ's love, to encourage them and perhaps share a few laughs too."

"I moved here from Hungary three years ago and I miss my family and friends. I live nearby and I know how it feels when older people are waiting for their relatives to come and visit them, but are so busy with working, raising children, and they do not have time. I have time to help, my family lives in Hungary and I want to do something good here. Now I am visiting the residents every Saturday, just to help serve coffee and tea and ask how they feel. I listen to their stories, and I learn a lot from them. What I give them with my time, they give me back much more." "What started as an art therapy group has turned into countless laughs, smiles, and stories, but also admiration for the residents' willingness to try something new. So often I have heard "I've never done this before," followed by them getting right into the activity. I've learned so much about the residents I've been working with and look forward to seeing them every single week."

SUSTAINABILITY

ONE LIGHT BULB AT A TIME

At Evergreen Care we completed a full light retrofit in our Pointe community with all resident rooms, common spaces, and service areas receiving new LED lighting. In partnership with BC Hydro and Britelite the new lighting will enhance the visibility for our residents and team members for many years to come.

Sustainability was also on the forefront for making the decision to switch to the new technology. The old light fixtures were failing, and maintenance costs increased. With the new LED system, we can reduce the maintenance cost by 70% over the next 10 years and reduce the electricity consumption by 20%. Our maintenance team are continuously looking for opportunities to work with our partners and suppliers to improve resident experience while improving the sustainability and environmental stewardship of our operations.








MAJOR PROJECTS

WALLS ARE TAKING SHAPE AT LINWOOD

In November of 2021 we broke ground for the construction of our 97 suite Seniors Affordable Housing in Saanich. This new community replaces the 29-suite walk-up building that was previously there that due to its age was no longer meeting the needs and abilities of our residents. During the excavating process we encountered a rock outcrop which did slow things down because we needed to remove it by drilling and blasting.

Progress is well underway as our partner Knappett Projects has capably managed various challenges including supply chain delays, pandemic related labor shortages, and most notably a large rock right where the parking entrance is planned. With the foundation walls and slabs set we enter the summer season framing and the building itself is taking shape. With just a little more than a year of construction and finishing still to go, we anticipate welcoming residents into their new homes in the Fall of 2023.

MAJOR PROJECTS

INGLEWOOD CARE CENTRE REDEVELOPMENT

In partnership with the BC Housing and Vancouver Coastal Health Authority we continue to make progress on our planned redevelopment of Inglewood Care Centre. Baptist Housing has spent the past year listening to the needs of the community, consulting with our partners, and considering the future opportunities for seniors housing and care in West Vancouver.


Our phase one plan is to replace the existing 230 funded care beds with a state of the art 240 bed building on adjacent land. We have designed this new long term care building to provide a homelike environment where residents have their own suite in households of 12. Also taken into consideration in the building's design is implementing various features and systems that will reduce the effects of viral outbreaks.

The second phase of the planned redevelopment will include an additional 120 long term care suites, affordable housing for seniors and those working in the community and an independent living residence.
