### TEAM WELLNESS UPDATE

The vision of our wellness program is to cultivate a workplace community that supports and enhances the active pursuit of physical, social, mental, and spiritual well-being for all team members.

We prepare a monthly newsletter that focusses on a particular wellness theme. The newsletter is distributed on the first Wednesday of each month, and provides a variety of wellness resources to our team members.

Three members of our human resources team recently became qualified to deliver "The Working Mind" training to our team. The Working Mind is an evidence-based program (developed by the Canadian Association for Long Term Care in partnership with The Mental Health Commission of Canada) designed to promote mental health and reduce the stigma around mental illness in the workplace. The course provides participants with tools to identify mental health changes in themselves, and to build their own resiliency. We have offered the course to many leaders, and are expanding to all team throughout the remainder of the year.

Another wellness initiative is led by our chaplains, who have developed wellness-centred resources to help our team understand compassion fatigue and navigate and process the grief that is an inevitable part of our care for seniors. Our chaplains are delivering short "lunch n learns" to present this valuable information to the teams, so they are better equipped to manage grief.







# SPIRITUAL CARE

#### **EMPHASIZING PRAYER**

As a spiritual care team, we have chosen Colossians 4:2-6 to be theme verses for us in our ministry. "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful. And pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should. Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone."

Our heart is to engage in meaningful connections with others and as we have prayed, God has opened doors in ways only he can do. This passage also encourages us to be more sensitive to the Spirit's work in others and to listen carefully so we can respond wisely and graciously. Through open doors God has provided we have built relationships through such

diverse opportunities as a writer's group, helping others reconcile with estranged family members, and doing birthday interviews.

One of our chaplains was visiting a resident in the hospital in a two-person room and closing his time by reciting the Lord's Prayer together. He noted that a lady behind an adjoining curtain was quietly repeating the prayer with them. After his meeting he gently pulled the curtain back and mentioned that he heard her pray with them. They struck up a conversation and he was able to minister to her during her time of need. He found out that she had asked the hospital to send her a chaplain, but they said no one was available. She then prayed that God would send her one. A blessed divine appointment orchestrated by our loving Father.

Dave began a crib club for men since he realized there were few activities designed for men. Hazel came to the rescue when she realized a resident was not able to sew her favorite pajamas. Helena leads line dancing to expand the options for needed physical activities for residents. One of our pet therapists received a call that the health of one of the residents she visits was declining. She immediately came to support

him and his daughter. Joan initiated a card making group to engage those residents who have no visitors on the weekends. James goes home every week and learns a song in the native language of several of our residents and comes back every week to perform and sing.

## SHANNON OAKS VANCOUVER RENOVATION

The pictures are hung and the finishing touches in place. Over the past year, our residents and dedicated team at Shannon Oaks Vancouver embarked on a comprehensive transformation of the main floor. The renovation's aim was to enhance the overall resident experience and create inviting and comfortable environments that foster a vibrant sense of community.

The focal point of the renovation was to modernize and elevate the dining room by reimagining the layout and design to improve functionality and cater to diverse preferences. Other highlights of the main floor transformation include a smaller dining room for those wanting a reservation, a garden room to enjoy an afternoon coffee or an evening card game, and an all-new beauty salon with an adjacent treatment lounge.













# SHANNON OAKS VANCOUVER RENOVATION

The library computer lounge, washrooms, and even the kitchen were included in the enhancements. Throughout contemporary furnishings, colour schemes, and lighting were used to create a visually appealing and aesthetically pleasing ambiance that promotes relaxation and socialization.

### SUSTAINABILITY

#### **CARBINX TECHNOLOGY**

In October 2022 we started to replace the aged hot water heating system at Evergreen Heights. The new system increases the efficiency by about 20% overall due the new modulation boilers and new control system. As we are always trying to improve efficiency, we were able to incorporate a new incorporate solar energy system. The solar system will pre-heat the water residents are using throughout the day and improving the hot water recovery.

The system will pay for itself for the next five years. The annual project cost savings is around \$4,500 with an estimated life cycle of 25 years. The total annual gas savings are 226 GJ and a reduction of natural gas use.

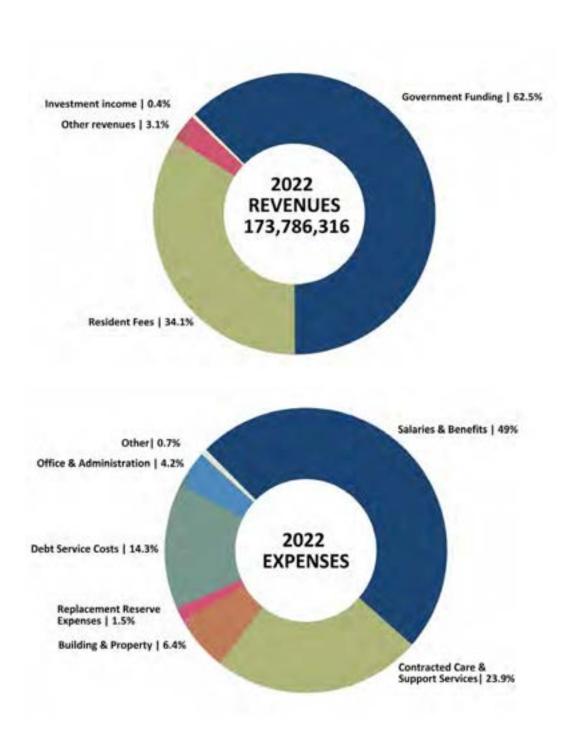




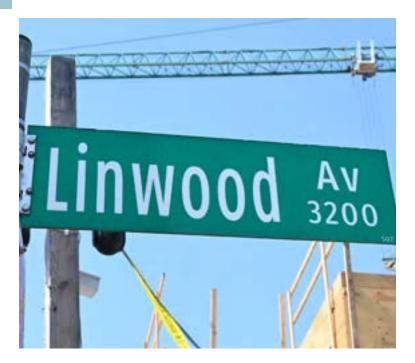
