SPIRITUAL CARE

The tag line for our spiritual care team is "Sharing the journey and the hope of Christ with others." We do this by being present with others. We listen carefully as they share their joys and burdens. Colossians 4:2 is our guide, "Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful." God guides us to those who need his touch in their lives. We watch what God is doing and over time doors are opened to deeper conversations and opportunities to share the hope of Christ. Here are thoughts from our chaplains about sharing life's journey with others:

"One of the great privileges I have as a chaplain is to walk with people as they face

the final days of their lives. There is a sense of spiritual intimacy that develops, with residents, and with their family members."

After a resident lost her mother. "I will continue to provide spiritual support and be available to assist her in any way needed during her grieving process."

Regarding a seeker, "I invited him to join me in prayer and he agreed. I prayed for God's presence in his life and the Holy Spirit's guidance as he continues to pursue the truth of Jesus Christ."

"On Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent I walked through our community offering to place ashes on team members' foreheads

or hands with a reminder of our frailty and God's forgiveness and love. Dozens of team members ask me for this ministry, and it leads to spiritual conversations that I would not have otherwise."

"I asked a new resident I was getting to know if she ever attended our chapel or bible study. She responded, 'Oh, well, I'm not a Baptist.' I smiled and explained that chapel was a nondenominational experience where all people could come together for prayer, singing, Scripture reading, and reflection."

Sharing the journey with others is rewarding and is part of offering exceptional holistic care to our residents.





TEAM WELLBEING

The vision of our wellbeing program is to cultivate a workplace community that supports and enhances the active pursuit of physical, social, mental, and spiritual wellness for all team members.

In 2023, we were able to advance this vision by offering The Working Mind program to 240 team members and leaders across Baptist Housing. The Working Mind is an evidence-based program, developed by the Canadian Mental Health Commission of Canada, that is designed to promote mental health and reduce the stigma around mental illness in the workplace. We have 13 sessions scheduled for 2024, so we will equip another 250 team members with the valuable tools and resources of this program.

Our chaplains continue to lead an initiative that supports our team to understand compassion fatigue and to navigate the grief that is integral to senior care. To date, over 200 team members across the ministry have participated in this education to gain these valuable resources.

We continue to grow our library of resources by providing links, articles and videos on our MyBH intranet. These include, but are not limited to, our monthly My Wellbeing Newsletter and our Employee and Family Assistance Program.

The wellbeing of our teams is significantly impacted by their ability to balance work and life. This has been challenging over the past few years, as we experience unprecedented staffing shortages resulting in deep impacts to our team. Fortunately, we are making great strides in our recruitment efforts, and have successfully hired 31 nurses across the ministry! These additional team members will provide our teams with much needed leadership, consistency, and clinical support.



VOLUNTEERS

Just as individual threads fortify a weave, each volunteer's unique experiences enrich our collective capacity to thrive and create positive changes within Baptist Housing and beyond.

Whether through activities such as pet therapy, organizing medical supplies for international aid to Ukraine and Guatemala, sharing life stories, painting classes, playing, singing hymns, celebrating birthdays, or teaching ballroom dance, each effort exemplifies the compassionate principles of Jesus Christ.

Testimonies from individuals underscore the transformative power of volunteering. June, "I never was the one who could sit and do nothing, I want to do something so volunteering in the store really saved me," Hazel and her son Fraser, "every bit has been rewarding and positive not just for us but for residents as well" Darryl, "I am using old skills to do something for someone else" Marcus, "volunteering is beneficial for me! I am learning many new skills."

Through diverse forms of engagement, residents experience a profound sense of interconnectedness and fulfillment such as: "We did not have birthdays in my family, it was 16 kids but now with volunteers I celebrate my birthdays," "when I interact with volunteers, I feel useful and alive again," "they brighten my day," "I am merrier around volunteers," "volunteers are awesome."

Our volunteers service and camaraderie not only strengthen the fabric of Baptist Housing communities but also affirm our shared commitment to provide exceptional care to those we serve.

Our volunteers cultivate a sense of belonging and purpose as they collectively contribute their time and talents and embrace the transformative potential of volunteerism in the lives of the residents they serve and in their personal lives.

These results not only benefit our organization but also enable us to enhance support for residents and improve our building infrastructure, driving us towards a greener future.

SUSTAINABLITY

We are thrilled to share groundbreaking news regarding the installation of Gas Absorption Heat Pump (GAHP) systems at Evergreen Terrace in White Rock, and The Heights at Mount View in Victoria. This project, undertaken in partnership with Fortis BC, marks a significant milestone in sustainable energy solutions for large-scale commercial buildings in Canada.

Baptist Housing is proud to be a part of this pioneering initiative, which represents the first of its kind in Canada. The installation of GAHP systems at Evergreen Terrace and The Heights at Mount View underscores our commitment to environmentally responsible practices and innovation in the field of energy efficiency.

Scheduled for startup in April 2024, the GAHP systems will undergo rigorous testing over a 12-month period to ensure optimal performance and efficiency. This testing phase will serve as a critical step in validating the effectiveness of these systems in reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions while meeting the heating and cooling needs of the buildings.

Projections indicate a remarkable GHG reduction of 45% during the heating season and 25% during the cooling season for both Evergreen Terrace and The Heights at Mount View. These anticipated reductions underscore the significant impact that

GAHP technology can have on mitigating climate change and advancing sustainability goals.


